
The book we will be discussing this month is "A Little Italian Hotel"



## A Note or Two from Finance

Several months ago I announced in church one Sunday morning that our payroll Company (Complete Payroll Solutions) had been paying taxes to the federal government for Pastor KC. Because of his status as a citizen of South Korea, he has no responsibility to pay taxes to the United States.

The company assured us that this was being taken care of and that we should be receiving a refund from the IRS. Several phone calls and emails were made and we finally received word that the IRS had approved a full refund.

In addition to the mistakes made with Pastor KC's payroll we were finding mistakes almost every time payroll was run. Our church treasurer, Jill Skibel worked diligently to find another service. Payroll items are now being handled by ADP.

Shortly after notifying Complete Payroll that we would be changing services the first of the year, we received the paperwork that they had filed on our behalf to recover those funds that had been incorrectly paid.

Fast forward to last week; we have received a full refund for those incorrectly paid taxes in the amount of over \$3,600.

Lastly, as you are all aware, our in-person services were cancelled the last two weeks because Mother Nature knows it is winter and wanted to share some snow with us. While the weather has not been good, our expenses to maintain our church and our missions continue. I'm asking that if all possible you try and get your weekly offering to the church. On behalf of the Finance Committee, I want to personally thank you for your financial commitment to OUR church!!

# Clothing shed at FAITH UNITED METHODIST CHURCH <u>SPREAD THE WORD</u>!

#### What a wonderful time to clear out the old to make room for the new. Clean those closets and drawers and donate to the shed to help your church and those less fortunate...it's a WIN, WIN!!

If you are not familiar with the clothing donation shed, it's designed to give community members a uniquely clean, convenient, and well-cared-for option to donate their used clothing to. St. Pauly Textile Inc., the company that has provided the shed, partners with businesses and various organizations to distribute donated items both here in the U.S. and worldwide, where they are ultimately re-worn by people who need them. FAITH UNITED METHODIST CHURCH receives funding for donated clothing, and additionally has the option to use donations to serve community needs.

With over 1,300 clothing drop-off sheds in place, St. Pauly Textile Inc. collects over 90,000 pounds of clothing every day and estimates that this clothing ends up in 44 different countries (including the U.S.) yearly. In 2019, the company was able to help keep over 20 million articles of clothing out of landfills, which clothed an estimated 2.5 million people worldwide. The company was founded in 1996 and is an A+ rated member of the Better Business Bureau.

Accepted items: clothing, shoes, belts, purses, blankets, sheets, curtains, pillowcases, and stuffed animals.
