Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ!

Here comes November, and Election Day is near. Each political candidate of federal, state, and local public officials tries to gain more votes than their opponents to win and to be elected. They propose their vision, ideas, and policies, and promise a bright future for their voters. They promote the idea that they will provide a better result than what their opponents would bring. While candidates advertise their agenda, voters get information that candidates offer, compare them with others, and determine which candidate will be the best for the common good or their interests.

In his journal on October 6, 1774, John Wesley recorded his thoughts on the Bristol election of November 3, 1774. Although there is a large gap of 250 years, it seems to me that Wesley's advice is still relevant today. The advice for "those of our society", that is Methodists, is as below: "(1) to vote, without fee or reward, for the person they judged most worthy; (2) to speak no evil of the person they voted against; and (3) to take care their spirits were not sharpened against those that voted on the other side." Don't you think it's worth considering and taking his advice at present?

The Bible says, "If anyone is in Christ, there (or "that person") is a new creation" (2 Cor. 5:17, NRSVUE). And as a new creation in Christ, we are "ambassadors for Christ" (2 Cor. 5:20) who are entrusted "the message of reconciliation" (2 Cor. 5:19). In this season of elections, let the world see and hear "the message of reconciliation" through our words and deeds. Please make peace with those around us, whether they support the same candidates as you do, cast your ballots carefully. Thank you.


